Curriculum Vitae

Andrés Rodríguez Pose

Professor of Economic Geography at the London School of Economics, where he was Head of the Department of Geography and Environment between 2006 and 2009. He is a past-President of the Regional Science Association International (RSAI) (2015-2017). He served as Vice-President of the RSAI in 2014 and was also Vice-President (2012-2013) and Secretary (2001-2005) of the European Regional Science Association. He is a regular advisor to several Directorates of the European Commission, the European Investment Bank, the World Bank, the Cities Alliance, the OECD, the International Labour Organization, the Food and Agriculture Organization, the Inter-American Development Bank, and the Development Bank of Latin America, among others. He is a part-time Professor of Innovation at the University of Stavanger (Norway). He was awarded the 2018 ERSA Prize in Regional Science, arguably the highest prize in regional science, and has been a holder of a European Research Council (ERC) Advanced Grant and of a prestigious Royal Society-Wolfson Research Merit Award. In 2019 he received Doctorates Honoris Causa from Utrecht University (the Netherlands) and Jönköping University (Sweden). He is an editor of Economic Geography, and sits on the editorial board of 33 other scholarly journals, including many of the leading international journals in economic geography, human geography, regional science and management.

Alessandra Faggian

Professor of Applied Economics, Director of Social Sciences and Vice Provost for Research at the Gran Sasso Science Institute, L'Aquila, Italy. She is also past-President of the North American Regional Science Council (NARSC), current co-editor of Journal of Regional Science and previous editor of the journal Papers in Regional Science. Dr Faggian's research interests lie in the fields of regional and urban economics, demography, labour economics and economics of education. Her publications cover a wide range of topics including migration, human capital, labour markets, creativity and local innovation and growth. She has co-authored over 80 academic publications. Her articles have appeared in journals such as Oxford Economics Papers, Cambridge Journal of Economics, Feminist Economics, Regional Studies, Papers in Regional Science, Journal of Regional Science and The Journal of Economic Geography. Alessandra is the 2007 recipient of the Moss Madden Memorial Medal by the Regional Science Association International: Irish and British section (RSAIBIS) for the best paper published in the year 2006 and the 2015 recipient of the Geoffrey Hewings Award by The North American Regional Council for outstanding research contribution by a young scholar in the field of regional science. In a recent ranking of the top 100 regional scientists in the world (Rickman and Winters, 2016), she was ranked 19th.

Phill McCann

Professor of Urban and Regional Economics in the University of Sheffield Management School. He is also the Tagliaferri Research Fellow in the Department of Land Economy at the University of Cambridge 2015-2018 and Honorary Professor of Economic Geography in the Faculty of Spatial Sciences at the University of Groningen, The Netherlands, 2017-2022. He is a highly cited and widely published spatial economist and economic geographer, with over 3000 ISI-Web of Science citations (over 400 in 2016), over 4000 Scopus citations (over 600 in 2016) and more than 11,000 Google Scholar citations. He has also been a Special Advisor to two European Commissioners, an advisor to the European Commission, the OECD, the European Investment Bank, as well as government ministries and research institutes in several countries. He has previously given 180 keynote lectures and invited talks at conferences and seminars across 31 countries and 5 continents, including: the European Parliament; the OECD Paris; The United Nations Geneva; the FAO United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation Rome; the European Commission; the Australian Parliament; the Reserve Bank of New Zealand; the New Zealand Treasury; The Federal Reserve of New York; HM Treasury UK; the UK Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy; and the UK Department for Communities and Local Government. Aspects of his research and analyses have been discussed in the Financial Times, The Guardian, The Washington Post, Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung, The New Zealand Herald, the Wellington Dominion Post, the UK Channel 4 Dispatches programme, and also by commentators in various countries, including The Rt Hon Gordon Brown, UK Prime Minister 2007-2010.

Raúl Ramos

Professor at the Department of Econometrics, Statistics and Applied Economics of the University of Barcelona, researcher at the Grup d'Anàlisi Quantitativa Regional (AQR-IREA), IZA Research Fellow and GLO Fellow. Currently, he is the Vice-Dean of Research and Doctorate of the Faculty of Economics and Business of the University of Barcelona. His research interests include labour market analysis from both regional and international perspectives, with a specific focus on the impacts of globalisation, European integration and migration on wage inequality and unemployment. He is Coeditor of the European Journal of Development Research, Director of the Revista de Economía Laboral and Associate Editor of Regional Studies, Regional Science.

Dani Arribas-Bel

Senior Lecturer in Geographic Data Science at the Department of Geography and Planning, and member of the Geographic Data Science Lab at the University of Liverpool (UK), where he directs the MSc in Geographic Data Science. From 2020 to 2023, he is also an ESRC Fellow at the Alan Turing Institute. Member of the development team of the open source library PySAL for spatial analysis in Python, he created "contextily", a small Python package to use web tile services in static maps. Since 2019, he is co-editor of "Environment and Planning B - Urban Analytics and City Science" and, since 2020, also in the editorial panel of "Journal of the Royal Statistical Society, Series A - Statistics in Society". His main research interests are: Geographic Data Science and New Forms of Data, Urban Economics and Regional Science, and Open Source Scientific Computing and Reproducibility.

Federico Pablo- Martí

Federico Pablo Martí holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Alcalá and a Master's degree in Industrial Economics from the University Carlos III. He is currently an associate professor of Applied Economics in the Department of Economics at the University of Alcalá. He has been a visiting researcher at the Institute for Development Strategies at Indiana University. His main areas of research are regional economics, transport and agent-based simulation models from the perspective of complex networks, fields in which he has published several national and international papers.
